

Job Title: Physical Education Teacher

Job Purpose:

The Physical Education Teacher will design and implement dynamic, engaging lessons that foster the development of sports skills, fitness, and healthy lifestyles for elementary school students. This role involves monitoring student progress, maintaining detailed records, and collaborating with parents, teachers, and other professionals. The teacher will also participate in ongoing professional development to continuously improve their skills and instructional techniques.

Qualifications:

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited institution (required).
- Bachelor's degree in Physical Education or a related field (preferred).
- Florida Teaching Certificate in Elementary Physical Education or eligibility to receive one.
- Strong knowledge of child development and motor skill progression in elementary-aged children (K-5).
- Passion for promoting physical activity, wellness, and healthy habits.
- Ability to develop creative, age-appropriate lesson plans that address diverse learning styles and abilities.
